Across the globe, conflicts are causing devastating damage to homes and neighborhoods, leaving millions without a place to call home. Reconstruction efforts in Ukraine should focus on innovative and resilient architecture and urban planning that meet immediate needs while laying the groundwork for long-term sustainability. These efforts could also provide valuable insights for other regions facing challenges, such as war recovery, resource scarcity, or climate change adaptation.



100 workshop participants will work in four studios at four scales, with proposals spanning from the macro to the micro scale: Sea Scale, City Scale, District Scale, and Home Scale. Join our discussion!
